Learning Powers

At Godwin Junior School we promote and encourage seven different learning powers: being curious, persevering, evaluating, collaborating, embracing mistakes, explaining reasoning and considering choices.



This week, we'll focus on why it is important to be curious.

1.Humans are naturally curious! We can see this in the way babies explore their surroundings and the questions toddlers ask. We want to encourage and praise this curiosity so that our pupils carry it into their adult lives.

2.Curiosity caused early humans to explore the planet and develop the origins of technology and science. It literally shaped the world we live in. Curious learners can become the scientists and engineers of tomorrow, improving lives and solving problems.

3.Curious learners achieve better results in school because they are more engaged and enjoy their learning more.

4.Did you know that curious people are happier? Research has shown curiosity to be associated with higher levels of positive emotions, lower levels of anxiety, more satisfaction with life and greater psychological well-being.
5.Curiosity can expand our empathy. When we are curious about others and talk to people outside our usual social circle, we become better able to understand those with lives, experiences and worldviews different than our own.


