## Head Teacher's Message

Thank you to everyone who has been walking, scooting and cycling to school during our Big Pedal fortnight. We currently have gold accreditation with the TfL Stars programme which promotes sustainable, active travel and want to keep this fantastic achievement.
Those of you who use the front entrance will have seen the huge banner we have put up this week about the dangers to our children's health from 'idling' - leaving the car engine running while the vehicle is stationary. New data from

Breathe London reveals that almost $40 \%$ of the highly polluting Nitrogen Oxides at our schools comes from road transport, with diesel cars being the single biggest local contributor.
Scientists have calculated that an idling car can fill up to 150 balloons with harmful emissions every minute. An idling engine can produce up to twice as many exhaust emissions as an engine in motion.
Please help our children to stay healthy by reducing your use of cars as much as possible and always switching the engine off when you are parked up.
