



Article of the Week











Article 2 of the UNCRC asserts that every child deserves protection of their rights, regardless of race, age, or gender, ensuring access to necessities for growth and development.

Stephen Lawrence, aged 18, fell victim to an unprovoked racially motivated attack in London on April 22, 1993. Only two of his attackers were convicted in 2012, which was facilitated by the Lawrence family's relentless advocacy for a change in the law enabling their prosecution. The Macpherson Report, investigating the mishandling of Stephen's case, exposed institutional racism within the Metropolitan Police (this is racism at all levels of the police).

Stephen aspired to be an architect, but his life was tragically cut short. We must champion equality and denounce discrimination, advocating for dignity and equal opportunities for all. In honour of Stephen's memory, after 31 years, let us strive for a fairer and more equitable society.

Let's stand against discrimination and work towards a society that embraces justice and equality. Stephen's legacy should inspire us to effect positive change. Let's show racism the red card.

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
