Head Teacher's Message

We celebrated Children's Mental Health Week with our Pizza-Pick-Me-Up-Party last Friday. This was a lovely way to reinforce the message that mental wellbeing is as important as physical health and that talking about our worries can help. A few simple touches transformed our dining hall and our children enjoyed teachers acting as waiters for the day! The photos show how popular this was and so thank you to Ms Jones and Ms Aslam for making this such a success.

Internet Safety Week had us focus in particular on the theme of 'Too good to be true? Protecting yourself and others from scams online'. As part of our commitment to equip every pupil with the essential skills they will need to thrive in our ever-changing digital society, we invited the Met Police to meet with our Year 6 children and discuss Cyber Security. The sessions were both informative and engaging, with the importance of setting strong passwords being an area that we hope will have an immediate impact - Year 6 families, please ask your child to explain what they learned.

An enormous well done to all of the children who performed in our Raised Voices competition. In previous years, children had studied and then chosen particular speeches to deliver but this time it was all their own work. We know how passionate our pupils are about issues which affect them and our world; hearing the speeches they had written spoken with such confidence and conviction was breath-taking. Those families who attended the final this week were incredibly impressed by how articulate Godwin children are and how they are able to convey their points so persuasively. We will definitely be asking our pupils to share these speeches again in the near future. Thank you to Ms Smith for once again organising a high-quality experience for our children.

Thank you to everyone who attended our Parent/Carer Conferences. It was lovely to see so many families and we hope that the opportunity to look through your child's books and discuss progress with their teacher was really informative. Apologies that staff illness meant we had to postpone some meetings - I'm sure you can appreciate that teachers are very susceptible to all of the bugs which are currently doing the rounds! We will contact those affected to reschedule appointments after the half-term break. This was the first time that we had tried an online booking system and so it would be useful for us to learn how this was for families - we know that some people had issues and we were happy to help them book appointments, but would appreciate your feedback in preparation for future events.

Thank you also to those who completed our Parent/Carer Survey. We asked the same questions that Ofsted do when they inspect schools in order to help us evaluate what we do and how we do it. We are collating your feedback and plan to share the results with you shortly after the half-term break. As I'm sure you already know, school is closed to pupils tomorrow; we look forward to welcoming them back on Monday 24th February. We wish you all a happy week!











6K - Eli: for persevering and making excellent improvements in his writing






