Our Year 3 children enjoyed very informative science workshops this week which was a fantastic way to engage them at the beginning of their new topic; the children's faces illustrated the sense of wonder the experiments created and the curiosity they piqued. Thank you to Ms Ouellette for organising this enrichment opportunity.

Our Year 6 children have been visiting The Victoria and Albert Museum to complement their history learning about The Early Islamic Civilisation. We are incredibly lucky to have free access to so many invaluable sources of learning and ensure that Godwin children visit a significant number of galleries, museums and places of religious worship during their time with us.



In assemblies, we often focus on significant religious and cultural events. This week, the children have been exploring the traditions and celebrations of the Chinese New Year. They have learned about the significance of this festival, including the zodiac animals, special customs and how families celebrate around the world. This learning builds on all we do to promote UNCRC Article 14 (Freedom of thought, belief and religion) and the British Values of Tolerance and Mutual Respect.

In addition to the questions above, which are the same ones Ofsted ask when they visit schools, there was also the opportunity for parents and carers to include comments about points they wanted to share. It was great to hear so many positive experiences and to receive recognition for the dedication of the teaching team — thank you. It is also helpful for us to be aware of specific issues some families wanted to raise. In the interests of space, I will respond to some below and others next week:

- In reply to a query about smart 'phones in school, Godwin children are not allowed to bring mobile 'phones/smart watches etc to school. This has been our position for a number of years.
- Payment can now be made by debit/credit card, as well as cash, for after-school clubs and residential visits. As our bank charges us for transactions made in this way, we unfortunately will need to add an additional fee to cover this. Sincere apologies – this is beyond our control.
- Some parents and carers expressed that they would like more access to their child's class teacher. Unfortunately, as teachers are in class on a full-time basis they cannot be available at the start of the school day as they are teaching. We know that the end of the day is a busy time and that if you want a private conversation with your child's teacher this may not always be possible then. Equally, we appreciate that working parents/carers may not collect their child at 3:25pm.Please can we suggest that if you want to speak to your child's class teacher privately, you email the school office: info@godwin.newham.sch.uk and your email will then be forwarded to the relevant person. You will usually receive a reply the following day, once the class teacher has had time after school to read and respond to your message. If your email is serious enough to need a response the same day, we will do our very best to do so. There are only two members of the admin team and myself who can access emails sent to this address, so please be assured that any information will be treated confidentially.
- There were a couple of questions asking whether there was parity in terms of the
 places of religious worship that children visit whilst at Godwin. During the four years
 that pupils are here, they visit buildings of the faiths they study, including: church,
 mosque, gurdwara, Hindu temple, synagogue. As with all educational visits, we know
 the value that these experiences add to children's learning.

Vocal Academy at Westfield





Article 30 of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) recognises the rights of children belonging to minority or indigenous groups to enjoy their own culture. Article 31 acknowledges children's rights to participate in cultural activities.

In 2025, the Chinese zodiac welcomes the Year of the Snake, symbolising wisdom, creativity, and intuition. Celebrating cultural traditions like Chinese New Year fosters a sense of identity and belonging, promoting children's rights to engage in and take pride in their heritage.


