# The Speak Up! Conference








A number of our School Councillors attended the Newham School Council Network Conference Speak Up! this week. They were excellent ambassadors for our school, embodying all of our Learning Powers, particularly Collaboration and Curiosity. Well done to all of them for representing us so well. The event explored the UNCRC right to be heard (Article 12) and linked to the Sustainable Development Goals, particularly climate action (SDG 13).

Our School Councillors discussed their role and how to start conversations with new people. Highlights included talks from the Head Teacher of Keir Hardie Primary School and UCL Climate Change Hub academics, inspiring action on significant issues like climate change.

Ivy in 4K, shared that she now better understands her role, while Jaya in 4T, left with many ideas for our climate change mitigation challenge that was launched at the conference: Let's not lose it, let's reuse it. Once our School Council has finalised its plans, we will let you know the small actions we will collectively be taking to make a difference.




