Recycle your Electrical Items at Godwin Junior School!



We have joined with over 30 schools across East London to recycle unwanted electrical items. Bring anything with a plug, battery or cable to be recycled in the big pink bin at the front entrance to our school.

Search your drawers for old mobile phones, broken cables and devices or other electrical items you no longer use.

Items smaller than a microwave can be accepted in the pink bins, including batteries contained within items. Please note this excludes vapes, loose batteries or light bulbs, which can be recycled in dedicated containers at any of the Reuse and Recycling Centres or find your local collection point at Recycle Your Electricals.

Did you know, electrical items wrongly placed in household bins can cause fires when collected and crushed by bin lorries. Always put electrical items in a dedicated recycling container. Never put electricals in any bin at home.

To remove personal data from phones and other items use this guide: <u>Prepare electricals for recycling - Recycle Your Electricals</u>

Items in good, working condition can be donated or sold using platforms such as Olio, Freecycle, Facebook marketplace or the British Heart Foundation.

If you would like help to fix a broken item, join us at one of the upcoming repair cafe events where trained fixers will be available for the repair of electrical items, bikes and clothes. Full details at: https://www.eastlondonwaste.gov.uk/repair-cafes. Dates will be added across the year.






